We work closely with data and artists, curators, art and design historians, and digital creatives. Position Context

The Dictionary of Australian Artists Online (DAAO) is a relational (SQL) database currently containing about 8,500 bibliographic entries of Australian Artists

(www.daao.org.au/intro/background.html). The DAAO has received an ARC LIEF infrastructure grant to upgrade, refine and extend the database into a new entity, which will be known as Design and Art Australia Online.
