BUCERIUS SUMMER PROGRAM IN INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS LAW

In today's globalized world, international business and the laws regulating it are no longer distinct disciplines. Having acknowledged the need to train legal professionals to face this development, Bucerius has been offering the Bucerius Summer Program in International Business Law since 2008. The aim of the program is to help participants meet the increasing demands of companies and law firms in the areas of international banking, trade law, commercial transactions and more. Interactive courses with distinguished academics and practitioners deepen participants' existing knowledge of these topics and increase their

understanding of the many forces shaping the field today. This year's selection of seven courses varies from International Commercial Sales by Professor Dr. Franco Ferrari (New York University Law School, USA) to International Mergers and Acquisitions by Dr. Florian <u>Drinhausen (Linklaters, Frankfurt)</u>. A course catalogue for 2012 is available online. From its inception, the program has been supported by Linklaters.

BUCERIUS SUMMER PROGRAM IN MEDIATION

For students with a strong interest in mediation, this highly interactive program is the perfect choice. Over the course of three weeks, students increase their understanding of mediation as an optional tool to solve business disputes. Experienced practitioners and academics explain recent findings and the theoretical background of the topics discussed. In addition, students work with professional mediators to hone their advocacy and problemsolving skills. The focus of the 2012 program is on "Business-to-Business (B2B) Mediation", which will be addressed through four mandatory courses. In addition to studying conflict management and advocacy skills, students will explore the legal framework as well as the psychological foundation of mediation. CREDITS

The course-credit system is based on the American Bar Association (ABA) guidelines, with one credit hour being equivalent to 700 minutes of classroom time. European students are able to earn ECTS points. All courses are worth one ABA credit, which is equivalent to two ECTS points.

GRADING AND TRANSCRIPTS

Depending on the course, your final grade may be evaluated through a class presentation or project, essay or take-home exam, or a final exam. In addition, regular attendance and active participation is required in all courses. At the end of the program, each participant obtains a certificate of participation and transcript of grades. It is at the student's home university's discretion as to whether the credits and grades earned at Bucerius will be recognized toward the student's degree program.

EXTRACURRICULARS

Academic studies at Bucerius are balanced by a variety of interesting extracurricular activities. Various events and excursions better acquaint participants with Hamburg and Germany's history and culture: city and museum tours, a visit to the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea, an excursion to Lübeck and much more!

ADMINISTRATION

The International Office assists students with administrative matters such as housing and visas. Around-the-clock access to the library, computer rooms and online legal databases, as well as wireless LAN on campus and an extensive extracurricular program are available to all students free of charge. An optional, intensive one-week German language course prior to the program is offered at an additional cost.

FEES

Tuition is the same for both 2012 Bucerius Summer Programs:

- Full Tuition Fee: 1.800€
- Early Bird Discount: 15% off the tuition fee for those who apply by January 15, 2012 and are accepted in the first selection round
- Alumni Discount: 15 % off for all Bucerius alumni

There is no application fee. Accommodation, books, public transportation, travel, etc. all come at an additional cost, so students should budget at least 1,000 € for their stay in Hamburg.

APPLICATION

The application deadlines are as following:

- To qualify for the early bird discount of 15%, students must submit their complete application by January 15, 2012
- All other applications must be received by April 30, 2012

Applications received after April 30, 2012 will only be considered if spaces are still available.

An application consists of the following:

- A completed and signed application form (available online)
- A transcript(s) of grades in English or German, including an explanation of the grading system used
- A personal statement explaining your areas of special interest and motivation for applying to the Bucerius Summer Program
- A current curriculum vitae or résumé
- Proof of English proficiency (Only if home university's primary language of instruction is not English: TOEFL IBT 90, IELTS 7.0, CAE or CPE (min. grade of B), ILEC)
- One passport-sized photo
