As China's first higher education institution to establish the educational system of Business Administration, the century-old Fudan University launched its business discipline as early as in 1917, and later set up the School of Business in 1929. Discover Shanghai and China's rich cultural life

Located in the Yangtze River Delta in eastern China, Shanghai sits at the mouth of the Yangtze River in the middle portion of the Chinese coast. The municipality borders Jiangsu and Zhejiang Provinces to the west, and is bounded to the east by the East China Sea.

During the Summer Program, you will take part in trips to the downtown area of Shanghai as well as some symbolic buildings of this city. Thus, you will get to know Shanghai face-to-face through several activities such as guided tours and traditional dinners/games. Besides, you will have the chance to explore some surrounding areas of Shanghai like Suzhou, Hangzhou etc.

Additionally, the Summer Program will give you the unique possibility of learning and working in a multicultural environment that promotes the understanding of different perspectives and brings together the participants' various educational and professional backgrounds.



Learn more from the industrial leaders

Shanghai's advantageous geographic location has enabled it to become one of the most important economic centers in the Far East. 184 multinational companies have set up regional headquarters in Shanghai.

Shanghai sits on the Yangtze River Delta on China's eastern coast. The region includes some of the fastest-growing economies in China in recent years, and as of 2004 has occupied over 21% of China's total gross GDP. Moreover, the metropolitan region is home to headquarters of a large number of world-famous multinationals such as Vale, Walt Disney and Kraft Foods.

Our company visits will include not only multinationals, but also China's industrial giants and market leaders. You will either see the production lines of a manufacturing company or talk to the company executives to learn more insights into their development strategy.
