About the Challenge

The challenge is:

- A business plan competition for creative individuals with business flair.
- A unique platform for international academic, cultural and professional exchanges.
- An opportunity to turn your ideas into innovative products or services.

You can join if you are:

- A full-time university undergraduate.
- A senior secondary school student. (as of 22-28 June 2013)

It is a unique opportunity to:

- Explore your innovative and entrepreneurial potential.
- Obtain exposure to the real business world.
- Expand your professional and social network.
- Develop your portfolio.

The Challenge consists of two Divisions:

- Secondary School Division.
- Universary Division (for undergraduates only).

Entry and Submission

To enter the challenge, you will need to:

- Have a brilliant business idea about a product or service, which must be under one of the sub-themes: Health & Wellness, Lifestyle, Environment & Sustainability or Corporate Social Responsibility/Social Enterprise.
- Form your team Each team should consist of three students plus one mentor (compulsory) in the Secondary School Division and three to four students in the University Division. You are welcome to create a 'joint team' with members from other secondary schools or universities.
- Obtain authorization from your school / university acknowledging that you are representing your home institution (Authorization form available on our website).
- Submit all requested information online and complete your registration on or before 31 October 2012.
- Submit your executive summary and business plan online on or before 1 December 2012.

Your submission needs to include:

- A 3-page executive summary of your business plan
- A business plan with a maximum of: 20 pages for Secondary School Division / 25 pages for University Division

Your business plan should be:

- Innovative and creative
- Technologically feasible
- Financially viable
- Clear in its organizational and management structure

Judging Criteria

Renowned entrepreneurs, business executives, school principals, professors and venture capitalists from Hong Kong and overseas will form the judging panel for the competition. You will be assessed based on your submission and presentation performance at the Semi-Final and Final rounds of the competition in Hong Kong.

Summary of the key areas of assessment:

Content of your business plan	75%
1. Innovation and Creativity	30%
2. Technical Soundness	20%
3. Organizational Plan & Management Structure	10%
4. Projection of Financial Performance	15%
Presentation at Semi-Final / Final rounds	25%
5. Delivery	10%
6. Time Management	5%
7. Q & A Session	10%

All submissions will undergo a paper based assessment. Thirty teams from each division will be shortlisted for the Semi-Final and Final rounds of the competition in Hong Kong. A round-trip economy ticket and accommodation will be provided for a maximum of three members from each of the shortlisted team for the Hong Kong visit.

From the Semi-Final, six teams from each division will be selected to enter the Final.

All shortlisted teams are expected to deliver a formal presentation to the judging panel in the Semi-Final and Final stages respectively.

Awards & Prizes

Gold, Silver, Bronze, Commendation and Theme awards will be allocated for each division. All winning teams will be presented with a trophy and cash prizes and each individual team member will receive a certificate.

- It is a compulsory requirement for each Secondary School Division team to have a mentor who must be full time employee of the representing school/college. The mentor will be required to accompany the team to/from Hong Kong at their own expenses and act as guardian of the team during the visit.
- All submissions must be original and team(s) will be disqualified if there is any evidence of copyright infringements or plagiarism.
- All submissions must be in English.
- All teams are automatically bound by the agreement in granting PolyU the right to reproduce, disclose or use the submitted
 materials for its publicity, marketing and other internal purposes.
- All teams are abide by the entry criteria and terms & conditions as listed on the website.
