UNSW Study Abroad, in collaboration with the UNSW Department of Hispanic Studies, offers students the opportunity to study Spanish intensively in Seville, Spain for four weeks.

Seville is the capital of Andalusia, an autonomous province in the south of Spain. Andalusia sits on the Mediterranean coast, across the sea from the north coast of Africa. Because of its location at the nexus of vibrant and contrasting civilisations, it has a rich and varied history, bringing together a striking blend of Berber, Islamic and traditional Spanish cultures.

Located on the plain of the River Guadalquivir, Seville is home to 700,000 inhabitants, making it the fourth largest city in Spain. Its fascinating history dates back over two thousand years to the days of the Roman Empire. Traces of the empire remain preserved in and around the city, allowing visitors to the sites glimpses into the past.

Global Opportunities

Arabic influences that came to the Iberian Peninsula in later years permeated the region and can still be felt in every sphere of life, from the city's architecture to its cuisine, gardens and literature.

Following Christopher Columbus' foray to the New World and the subsequent activities of the Spanish colonies, Seville became an important mercantile centre during the flowering of Spain's golden age.

Seville's impressive medieval and renaissance heritage is evident throughout the city's wellpreserved old town, now UNESCO world heritage listed. Architectural triumphs include the Cathedral of Seville, one of the largest Gothic cathedrals in the world; the Alcázares Reales de Sevilla, a royal palace that grew out of a Moorish fort; and the Plaza de España, an example of contemporary Moorish Revival architecture.

Today Seville is a dynamic and modern city offering a wealth of cultural activities, nightlife and gastronomy.



The Program

The Centro de Lenguas e Intercambio Cultural (CLIC) is a leading Spanish language school in Spain. Teaching only small groups, CLIC also provides a comprehensive social and cultural immersion program.

The following schedule describes a typical week (program subject to change):

18:00 - 19:30	Extra-curricular classes twice per week. A selection of history, phonetics, literature, arts history, Spanish customs and traditions, cookery, and Sevillana dancing

Housing

Housing with families will be allocated prior to departure for Spain. The families will provide breakfast and lunch each day. You will be the only native English speaker in your host family's household.

Program Fee

The fee for this immersion language and culture program is A\$2,300 per student. This fee covers:

- » Four weeks intensive Spanish language classes
- » Some of the evening extra-curricular classes are covered. Others will incur a small administration fee.
- » Housing in a single room at a family homestay, including half-board
- » Travel insurance (covered by UNSW for its students on study tours).

Excursions

CLIC also offers full-day excursions to Andalusian cities Córdoba, Jerez, Cadiz and Rónda.

There is also a two-day excursion to Granada, including accommodation, visit to the spectacular Al Alhambra and visits to other local monuments.

These excursions will incur additional costs.



Credit

This program has been approved by UNSW's School of International Studies. On successful completion of this four-week program, including the completion of all assessment tasks assigned by CLIC, and at least 80% attendance at classes, you will be granted 6UOC as transfer credit. This will be shown on your UNSW transcript as SPAN6206.

Eligibility

Students may study beginner level Spanish language courses and therefore there are no prerequisites to be eligible to enrol in this language course.

Please note that participants are required to stay in homestay accommodation organised as part of the package.

Students wishing to apply can obtain an application form from the UNSW Study Abroad office at Level 16, Mathews Building.

Getting there

The program fee does not include airfares. Flights can be difficult to obtain in January, so look at flight options as soon as you decide to join the program.

Your homestay accommodation will become available on Sunday 6 January 2013.

You can fly to Seville and take a taxi from the airport. The fixed price from the aiport to any address in Seville is \notin 20,70 during the week and \notin 23,08 on weekends, holidays and nights. There is an additional baggage handling fee.

You can also travel by bus from Málaga, or you can take the high-speed AVE train from Atocha station in Madrid. The high-speed train from Madrid takes approximately two and a half hours.

Students will need to vacate their housing on Saturday 2 February 2013.
