The Keio Short-Term Japanese Studies Program (KJSP)

The Keio Short-Term Japanese Studies Program (KJSP) is a two-week intensive program for students who wish to study in Japan. The program offers a variety of courses broadly related to Japanese politics, economy, business, arts, and traditional and modern culture in addition to on-site activities where students can see and experience the things they learned in the classroom only hours before. Participants will gain knowledge not only from the lectures by experienced faculty members and through a range of activities, but also through exchanges with current Japanese Keio University students who will also join the program. Moreover, students have a chance to learn "Survival Japanese" targeted toward first-time Japanese learners.

Providing students with short but intensive learning opportunities about Japan, this program is best suited for undergraduate or graduate-level students who are first-time students in Japan. We invite you to experience this exciting educational opportunity at Keio University this spring.

About Keio University

Dates January 29 - February 14, 2013

Location Keio University Mita Campus and Hiyoshi Campus (both located in the Greater Tokyo Metropolitan Area).

Accommodation All participants are scheduled to stay in apartment-type dormitories with easy access to both campuses. Each room is equipped with a private bathroom and a kitchenette. Each dormitory also has a series of shared rooms and multipurpose areas (shared kitchen area, a laundry room, shared computers, a Japanese tatami room, a music practice room, etc.).

Eligibility Applicants must be enrolled as full-time students in an undergraduate (bachelor's level) or graduate program (master's level) at a university that has a student exchange partnership with Keio University or from a member university of the Association of Pacific Rim Universities (APRU) and must not be currently studying in Japan. Participants must be fluent in English. No Japanese proficiency is required as all lectures and excursions are conducted in English.

Application Deadline December 5, 2012

Program Fee All participants are exempt from tuition and accommodation fees. Fees for transportation (airfare, public transportation fees in Japan, etc.), meals, excursions, and all other miscellaneous expenses must be borne by the participants.
