Course Structure

EBS Law Summer is suited to all levels of expertise in EU Law. An intensive one-week introductory course on the Law of the European Union (4 ECTS) equips students with the necessary foundations for the programme – regardless of background. Students then choose from 6 different electives dealing with more detailed questions of EU Business and Commercial Law.

Each elective is worth 2 ECTS and comprises at least 700 minutes of classroom teaching. The electives are complemented by a corresponding site visit (e.g. European Central Bank) and conclude with a final examination at the end of the programme. Students without previous knowledge of EU Law can delve into the topic within a relatively short period, whereas students having studied European Law before can deepen their knowledge in the various electives.

Certificate

Upon successful completion of the programme, participants are awarded an EBS Law Summer certificate. This details the final grade, credits earned and the course content, including all contact hours. Please note that as credit transfer is carried out by the EBS partner institution, students are advised to contact their study abroad advisor.

Added Extras

As an added benefit, we provide a free-of-charge crash course in the German Language during week one of the programme. Social, cultural and sightseeing activities also complement the academic programme.



Who can apply?

The programme is designed for advanced undergraduate as well as graduate students of law or business law. (Applicants should have completed at least one and a half years of studies.)

Tuition for EBS Partner Universities

Students of EBS partner institutions are exempt from tuition fees for this programme; however, they may be required to pay tuition fees at their home universities.

Tuition for non-partner Institutions

Students from non-partner institutions are assessed a tuition fee of 4000 Euros plus the applicable service fee.

The tuition fee (if applicable) and the service fee cover:

Credits

The introductory course on the law of the European Union is comprised of 1400 minutes classroom teaching and includes a visit to the European Court of Justice (4 ECTS).

Each of the six electives equals 700 min of classroom teaching (2 ECTS).
